So that ye **come behind in no gift;** waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ:

If therefore the whole church be come together into one place, and all speak with tongues, and there come in those that are unlearned, or unbelievers, will they not say that ye are mad? 1 Corinthians 14:23 KJV 1900

How is it then, brethren? when ye come together, every one of you hath a psalm, hath a doctrine, hath a tongue, hath a revelation, hath an interpretation. Let all things be done unto edifying. 1 Corinthians 14:26 KJV 1900

My brothers and sisters, some from Chloe's household have informed me that there are quarrels among you. 1 Corinthians 1:11 NIV

And I, brethren, could not speak unto you as unto spiritual, but as unto carnal, even as unto babes in Christ. I have fed you with milk, and not with meat: for hitherto ye were not able to bear it, neither yet now are ye able. 1 Corinthians 3:1–3 KJV 1900

Carnal

Greek: σαρκικός

Transliteration: sarkikos

Pronunciation: sar-kee-kos'

sar-kee-kos', which means fleshly.

Why were they able to operate in the spiritual gifts.

Spiritual gifts are of GRACE and not of works.

More importantly, the suffix 'ma' tells us that the gifts are the result of grace. So the technical definition of charisma is spiritual gifts of grace.

No more than two or three should speak in tongues. They must speak one at a time, and someone must interpret what they say. But if no one is present who can interpret, they must be silent in your church meeting and speak in tongues to God privately.

1 Corinthians 14:27–33 NLT

Let two or three people prophesy, and let the others evaluate what is said. But if someone is prophesying and another person receives a revelation from the Lord, the one who is speaking must stop. In this way, all who prophesy will have a turn to speak, one after the other, so that everyone will learn and be encouraged.

Remember that people who prophesy are in control of their spirit and can take turns. For God is not a God of disorder but of peace, as in all the meetings of God's holy people.

If any man think himself to be a prophet, or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things that I write unto you are the commandments of the Lord. But if any man be ignorant, let him be ignorant. 1 Corinthians 14:37–38 KJV 1900

Even so, if unbelievers or people who don't understand these things come into your church meeting and hear everyone speaking in an unknown language, they will think you are crazy.

1 Corinthians 14:23 NLT

But if all prophesy, and there come in one that believeth not, or one unlearned, he is convinced of all, he is judged of all:

The spirits of prophets are subject to the control of prophets.

Why do Pentecostal and charismatic churches disregard the guidelines that Paul laid down?

They lack an understanding of the purpose of gifts.

But if all of you are prophesying, and unbelievers or people who don't understand these things come into your meeting, they will be convicted of sin and judged by what you say. As they listen, their secret thoughts will be exposed, and they will fall to their knees and worship God, declaring, "God is truly here among you." 1 Corinthians 14:24–25 NLT

But he that prophesieth speaketh unto men to edification, and exhortation, and comfort. He that speaketh in an unknown tongue edifieth himself; but he that prophesieth edifieth the church. I would that ye all spake with tongues, but rather that ye prophesied: for greater is he that prophesieth than he that speaketh with tongues, except he interpret, that the church may receive edifying. 1 Corinthians 14:3–5 KJV 1900

¹² Even so ye, forasmuch as ye are zealous of spiritual gifts, seek that ye may excel to the edifying of the church.
